Gives to his wife an annuity of £4 for the term of 50 years, to be paid to her out of the rents and proceeds of his messuages, lands & tenements called Drim in the parish of Crowan, if she should happen to live that long.

Gives to his wife his dwelling house with the garden, stables, outhouses and appurtenances belonging to the same in Camborne where he currently resides.

Gives and bequeaths to his daughters Isabella, Johan and Anne £1,678...

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives & bequeaths to **his son Charles** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament when he reaches the age of 21 years. Until then he makes his good friend and **kinsman Thomas Worth** and **his brothers George Treweeke and Richard Treweeke** to be his executors in Trust

Gives to **his sister-in-law Thomasine Polkinhorne** a house and garden in Drim and 20 shillings to be paid to her yearly for the term of 40 years if she should live that long.

Gives to **Prudence the daughter of Richard Polkinhorne** 40 shillings toward her apprenticeship.
