I Give and Bequeath all my Goods and Chattles Moveables and Immoveabls of what nature or kind Soe Ever unto **My wife Mary** and **My Sonn John** Equally Betweene Them Makeing Them Both My Sole Executors All ways oblegenig Them both to Maine Taine all The rest of My Children dureing Ther Minority Untill They Shuld Com of Age to Mainetaine Them Sealves or Accomplish The Age of one and Twentie yeares Binding My Whole Estate if or They of itt in Testemony whereof I have heare unto Sett my hand and Seale The day and yeare Above Written.
