

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/T/2902 W.

Abstract of the Will of Marten Trewheela of the Parish of Towednack in the County of Cornwall, written 16 May 1763, proved 12 May 1764.

Gives 1 shilling to **his sister Mary Carnarten**.

Gives 1 shilling to **his sister Jane Trewheela**.

Gives 1 shilling to **his brother Christopher Trewheela**.

Gives 1 shilling to **his sister Chatren the wife of John Baragwanath**.

Gives to **his son William Trewheela** all his lands, premises and household goods in Chylason where he now lives. Also gives to **his son William Trewheela** his part in Ladydowns Crafts, excepting liberty for **his sons Matthew, Christopher and Martin Trewheela** to have access.

Gives to **his son Marten Trewheela** that part of his estate Marten holds in Amalibra, along with the Lower Meadow called the Higher Downs, which joins Lady Downs.

Gives to **his son Christopher Trewheela** that part of his estate in Amalibra called Barrys Field, along with Gat Field, the Wiley Field, and other lands.

Gives to **his son Matthew Trewheela** that part of his estate in Amalibra called the Higher Meadow, Lower Parkandars, the Bawos Own Widden, the outer Gwelroles, the higher part of the Never Gwelroles, the Higher Moor, and half of Old Downs.

Gives to his **wife Chatren Trewheela** pounds, to be paid by his son William Trewheela out of his estate of Chylason. Likewise directs that his son Christopher pay her 20 shillings per annum out of his part of Amalibra, his son Marten pay her 10 shillings out of his part of Amalibra, and his son Matthew pay her 10 shillings out of his part of Amalibra.

Gives £20 to **his daughter Allas**, to be paid by his son William Trewheela out of his estate in Chylason. He gives to Allas an additional £20 to be paid out of his estate in Amalibra, £10 from his son Christopher, and £5 each from his sons Marten and Matthew.

Gives £5 to **his granddaughter Ann the daughter of James Quick**.

Gives one guinea in gold to **his daughter Chatren the wife of James Quick**.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his son William Trewheela** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
