Item I doe make and appoynt **John Kittow my granson** my hole and sole Executor to see my will performed and my depts and Legassies payde and pay [to] Thomas Rosers? Foure pounds wich I borrowed of him and to this I doe subscribe my hand and seale the daye and yeare First A bove written
