In the name of God Amen. The first day of May Anno Dⁿⁱ 1617 I Willm. Treworles of the p'ish of Breage sicke of body but perfect of memory (prayse be to my God) doe make & ordaine this my last Will & Testament in manner & forme following, vz^t.

Imprimis I commend my soule unto Almighty God my Maker & Redeemer, and my body to the earth.

- It. I give to the poore mans boxe of the p'ish of Breage xijd.
- It. I give & bequeath to **John my sonne** one platter dish, and the of all my tynbounds.
- It. I doe give and bequeath to **Thomas Treworles my godsonne** one ewe lambe.

Itm. all other my goods & Chattells I doe give & bequeath to **Margarett my wief**, whome I doe make my whole executrix to see this my Will performed & my buriall solempnized. In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my signe.
