*The Will of Richard Trewyk of the Parish of Truro St. Mary in the County of Cornwall,  
written 9 Aug 1512, proved 24 Sep 1512.*

In the name of god Amen. The ixth Day of the month of August in the yer of or lord  
1511 I Richard Trewyk dwelling in the parrishe of Saint Mary Truro of the diocese of  
Exeter hole of mynde in good memory beyng thanked bee almighty god make  
ordayne and Declare this my present testament in this maner

First I geve my soule to almighty god to the blessed virgyn his mother and to all the  
glorious company of hevyn my bodye to the Will and disposicion of **John Trewyk my  
sonne**.

Item. I geve to the good and Works of the saide church of or lady of Truro x<sup>s</sup>.

The residue of all and singular my goods lands Rents and tenements moveable and  
unmoveable my debts paid and my body buried I geve and release to the said **John  
Treweek my sonne** Which John I ordeyne and make my soole executor of this my  
last Will and testament, And Nicholas Rowe supervisor of this my last Will. And he  
shalhave for his labour iii<sup>s</sup>. iiij<sup>d</sup>.
