Abstract of the Will of John Warne of Trevance within the Parish of St. Issey in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 19 Jun 1832, proved 14 Dec 1832.

Gives to **his three unmarried daughters Ann, Honor and Jane** his dwelling house where he now lives, and also the corn and hay mowhays, the meadow called Penkevean or Colman's Meadow, and the meadow adjoining the hay mowhay with the lower garden between Treethey's orchard and Biddick's house, all in Trevance. Additionally he gives them all his household goods and furniture, beds, bedding, plate, linen, china &c, as well as £450 to be equally divided between them and an annuity of £22 10s. each.

Gives to **his daughter Elizabeth the wife of William Kenner** an annuity of £5 during the life of her husband and, should she outlive him, he gives to her during her widowhood an annuity of £7.

Gives £20 to his grandchildren, sons and daughter of his said daughter Elizabeth Kenner.

Gives to **his daughter Grace the wife of James Hawke** an annuity of £2 10s. in case she becomes a widow.

Gives £100 to his said daughter Grace Hawke.

Gives to **his son Richard Warne** all his messuages, farms, lands, hereditaments and premises, mortgages, bonds, bills, ready money &c., appointing him sole executor of his will.

John Warne died 22 September and was buried in St. Issey on 25 Sep, aged 79 years.
