Abstract of the Will of Grace White of the Parish of Gwinear in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 17 May 1714, proved 9 Mar 1715/6.

Gives 20 shillings to **her brother John Andrewartha**.

Gives 20 shillings to **her sister-in-law Mary Andrewartha**.^{*}

Gives 40 shillings to **her kinsman John Andrewartha**.[†]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinsman Philip Andrewartha**.[‡]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinswoman Ann Potter**.

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinswoman Margaret Andrewartha**.[‡]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinswoman Grace Andrewartha**.[‡]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinswoman Alice Andrewartha**.[‡]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinsman Henry Cock**.[§]

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinsman Anthony Cock**.[§]

Gives 40 shillings to **her kinswoman Catherine Francis**.

All the rest of her goods and chattels she gives to **James Cock**,[§] appointing him sole executor of her last will and testament.
