Gives and bequeaths an annuity of £4 to his wife for the term of her natural life.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his daughter Elizabeth now the wife of Thomas Thomas als. Trelill.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his daughter Ann now the wife of James Symons.

Gives and bequeaths to **his youngest sons John and Edward** his tenement in Tregoning in the parish of Breage the profits of which will used for their maintenance until they reach the age of twenty-one years. He also gives them his estate in Chevirtoden.

Gives to **his sons William**, **Henry and George** his tenement called Trevorles *als*. Treworles, along with the rest of his goods & chattels, share and share alike, appointing them co-executors of his last will and testament.

Gives £5 to his grandson the son of James Symons.

Gives £5 to Ann the daughter of his daughter Elizabeth.

Gives 1 shilling each to his godchildren.
