Abstract of the Will of William Williams of Treworgie in the Parish of Probus and County of Cornwall, written 10 Jun 1658, proved 26 Apr 1660.

Gives 20 shillings to the poor of the parish of Probus.

Gives 20 shillings toward reparations of the parish church.

Gives to **his wife Thomasine** £40 together with an annuity of £12 during her widowhood.

Gives £10 to his daughter Mary Weekes and her children.

Gives 40 shillings each to **John Huddy, Henry Huddy, Thomasine Huddy, and Honor Huddy, children of his daughter Johan Huddy**, deceased.

Gives £5 to the children of his daughter Ann Kempe, deceased.

Gives £5 to the children of his daughter Elizabeth Robins, deceased.

Gives £5 to his daughter Thomas Goulley and her children.

Forgives his son William Williams the £100 he owes and currently holds.

Gives £40 to his grandson William, son of the said William.

Gives £5 each to his granddaughters Jane and Elizabeth, daughters of the said William.

Gives £700 to his son Ezekiel Williams with an annuity of £30 during his life.

Gives two shillings to each of his servants.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his son John Williams**, whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
