

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/298/303.

*Abstract of the Will of William Williams of Treworgie in the Parish of Probus and County of Cornwall, written 10 Jun 1658, proved 26 Apr 1660.*

Gives 20 shillings to the poor of the parish of Probus.

Gives 20 shillings toward reparations of the parish church.

Gives to **his wife Thomasine** £40 together with an annuity of £12 during her widowhood.

Gives £10 to **his daughter Mary Weekes** and her children.

Gives 40 shillings each to **John Huddy, Henry Huddy, Thomasine Huddy, and Honor Huddy, children of his daughter Johan Huddy**, deceased.

Gives £5 to the children of **his daughter Ann Kempe**, deceased.

Gives £5 to the children of **his daughter Elizabeth Robins**, deceased.

Gives £5 to **his daughter Thomas Goulley** and her children.

Forgives **his son William Williams** the £100 he owes and currently holds.

Gives £40 to **his grandson William, son of the said William**.

Gives £5 each to **his granddaughters Jane and Elizabeth, daughters of the said William**.

Gives £700 to **his son Ezekiel Williams** with an annuity of £30 during his life.

Gives two shillings to each of his servants.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his son John Williams**, whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
