

Prerogative Court of Canterbury Wills, PROB 11/1739/380.

Abstract of the Will of Abigail Page of Newington near Sittingbourne Kent, written 27 Mar 1828, proved 30 Apr 1828.

(Parts of the Will are illegible due to smudging.)

Gives and bequeaths to her niece Elizabeth Callaway all her household goods, linen, her watch and black brooch.

Gives to her nephew John Callaway her bible in two volumes and a gold brooch.

Gives to her nephew William Callaway an India gilt draught-----, and Watts World to come.

Gives to her nephew Richard Callaway The Death of Abel, the Death of Cain, and

Gives to her nephew Benjamin Callaway Pilgrims Progress and my Holy War.

Gives to her nephew James Callaway of Human Life Book and all my Books.

Gives to her niece Mary Ann Callaway a quilt and chest and its contents.

Gives to her niece Sarah Callaway a silver and a silver spoon.

Gives to her niece Frances Callaway a cotton and a quilt and

Gives to her niece Catherine Callaway a tea caddy.

Gives to her niece Harriet Callaway a tea box and a box.

Gives £50 to her niece Cordelia Chapman as well as the interest due in the -----ham Savings Bank and all her black clothes of every sort and and three pair of cotton stockings, three white pocket handkerchiefs, two pair of shoes, a blue silk shawl, a p----- box containing lace and two hymn books.

The remainder of her clothes she gives to be divided between her brother Benjamin Callaway's girls.

Gives £130 from the aforesaid savings bank to pay her bills, funeral expenses &c., the remainder to be divided equally between all of her brother Benjamin Callaway's children.

Appoints her brother Benjamin Callaway of Newington Kent, carpenter, sole executor of her last will and testament.
