Abstract of the Will of William Page of Aylesford in the County of Kent, Carpenter, written 10 Feb 1820, codicil 2 Apr 1820, proved 3 May 1820.

Appoints his wife Elizabeth Page sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Gives to <u>his wife Elizabeth</u> his lands and tenements in Ordinance Place, Chatham Kent, along with all his money, securities for money, household goods and chattels, for her to enjoy for the term of her natural life. After his wife's decease he wills the same to be equally divided between <u>his six children</u>, namely <u>Sarah Watson</u>, <u>William Page</u>, <u>Stephen Page</u>, <u>Richard Bristed</u>, <u>Mary Ann Page</u> and <u>Lucy Page</u>.

Codicil...

Forbids <u>his wife Elizabeth</u> to sell his lands and tenements and to keep them as they are to be divided between his children after her death.
