

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers,
PROB 11/173/336.

Abstract of the Will of Sir Thomas Coteel of Saint Martin Orgar in the City of London, Knight, written 13 May 1628, proved 17 Feb 1636/7.

Records that he was born in the city of Antwerp in the kingdom of Brabant and is now aged about three score and fifteen years.

Wills that his body be buried in the parish church of St. Martins Orgar.

Gives to his servants a year's wages, and black cloth for mourning.

Gives to Sir **Leventhorpe Franke***, Knight, a ring or piece of plate worth £10, and black cloth for mourning.

Gives to Sir **Richard Edgcombe***, Knight, a ring or piece of plate worth £10, and black cloth for mourning.

Gives to Sir **John Blagrove***, Knight, a ring or piece of plate worth £10, and black cloth for mourning.

Gives 40 shillings per week to **his son Daniell Coteel and his wife the daughter of Ambrose Rouse**, and £10 for mourning.

Gives to **his daughter Magdalene, wife of Sir John Blagrove**, and to his grandchildren, nothing, having confidence that his executor will distribute to them as they shall give him cause.

Names **his son Thomas Coteel** as his heir and sole executor, giving him all his lands and goods beyond the seas.

* sons-in-law

Per the Visitation of London, Thomas Coteel was living in 1634, aged about 79.
