Abstract of the Will of Edward Carleton, Clerk of Saint Dunstan Stepney, Middlesex, written 19 Oct 1716, proved 28 Aug 1718.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to his eldest son Bell Carleton.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to <u>his daughter Emm Swanley</u>. Also gives to her his first wife's picture and a silver lamp belonging to <u>his sister Porteen deceased</u>\*.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his youngest son Edward Carleton.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to his daughter Margarett Carleton.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to his friend Phillip Davies, rector of Bradenham, making him overseer of his last will and testament.

Wills that the marriage contract between him and <u>his now wife Mary</u> be complied with and performed by his executrix, paying all interest to her to him at the time of his decease.

All the rest, residue, and remainder of his estate both real and personal he gives and bequeaths to <u>his</u> said <u>daughter Margarett Carleton</u>, making her sole executrix of his last will and testament.
