

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers,  
PROB 11/1/256.

*Abstract of the Last Will and Testament of Wylliam Cressener of the Town of Cross in  
Boxted in the County of Suffolk, Esq., written 31 Mar 1444, proved May 1454.*

Wills that **Dame Margaret his wife** have all his manors, lands, tenements, rents &c.  
for the term of her life and after her death all his lands beforesaid remain to his son  
Alexander and his heirs forever.

Wills that **his son John**, after the death of his mother, have to him and his heirs  
legally begotten his manors called Clees? and . . . . . in the county of Essex with  
all their appurtenances... And in default of heirs the remainder goes to **John's  
brother Alexander** and his heirs. Also wills to his son John and his heirs his manor  
in the parish of Boxtede in the county of Suffolk with all its appurtenances. And in  
default of issue, the remainder goes wholly to Alexander his brother and his heirs....
