The Will of William Bassett of the Parish of Bletchingley in the County of Surrey, Miller, written 15 May 1690, proved 28 Jul 1690.

(Paragraphed)

In the name of God a men the 15th day of May According to the compittation of the church of England I William Bassett miller of Blechingly in the county of Sury being of perfictt memory and Remembrance praysed be God do make and ordain this to be my Last will and Testament in maner and forme following —

First I bequeth my Soul into the handes of Almighty God etc... and as for my body to be buried in Christon buriall at the Descretion of my Executrix heare after nominated.

Item. I give unto my son John Busett the som of one shilling of Lafull mony of Englan and the like to my dafter Mary Baset and my son Gorge Basett the sum of one shilling of Lafull mony of Englan.

Item. All the rest of my Goods I Leve to my Loveid wife Milbrowgh Basett and my son Edmond Basett upon Conditation that thay pay all my Debtes and Legucies Executrix of this my Last will but The Goods that was my wife Milbrowth aforesayd before I maryed her to be at hur disposing to her children etc... and ... after my wifes deses to be shifted between my sons William and Edward and Thomas and Robard Basett After hur deses this being my Last will and Testamentt Revocking all other wills in witness heare of I have sett my hand and sell the day and yeare furst above written An. Do. 1690.
