Gives 10 shillings to the poor of Horley.

Gives £20 to <u>his daughter Sara Bristowe</u>, £3 to <u>her son John Bristowe</u> and 40 shillings to <u>her daughter Joane Bristowe</u>.

Gives £3 to his daughter Phoebe.

Gives to Donum Hogget his second gown.

Gives to William Browne his black gown.

Gives to Stephen Browne his best cloak.

Gives 10 shillings to young Anthony Hogget.

All the rest of his goods he gives to <u>his sons Joseph Browne</u> and <u>Beniamin Browne</u> whom he makes co-executors of his last will and testament.
