The Will of John Byssh the Elder of the Parish of Burstow in the County of Surrey, Gentleman, written 26 Aug 1494, proved 16 Oct 1494.

(Paragraphed)

In dei nomine Amen the xxvi<sup>th</sup> day of the month of august in the yere of our lord MCCCCLXXXXIIII and in the x<sup>th</sup> yere of the Reigne of King Henry the vijth I John Byssh thelder of the parissh of Brustow in the Counte of Surrey gent hoole of mynde and in my goode memory Being lawde and praysyng Be unto allmyghty god make and ordeyne this my present testament conteynyng my last will in this manner as followyth.

Furst I Bequeith and comyt my soule to allmyghty god etc...

Also I geve and bequeith by this my present testament to <u>John William Robard Rose Anne and Augustyne my children</u> My tenement callyd Tryndyllys with thappurtenances lying in Burstowe aforeseid with the parcell of land callyd Dollyngys and Aesawe? in the seid parish. And also my tenement with thappurtenances lying in the paryssh of Worth and my parcell of land lying in the paryssh of Horne equally betwyx them to be delivered and . . . . . . by the . . . . . . discretion of myn executor underwretyn to have and to hold to them forever holdyng of the chefe lords of the Fee thereof by service due and of right . . . . . .

And the residue of all and singular my moveabyll goodys catalls . . . . . . and dettys after my dettys payd my burying made and this my present testament fulfyllyd I will that it Be equally devided . . . . . . among my seid childeren therewith to doe and dispose . . . . . .

And of this my present testament I make and ordeyne myn executores that is to sey the forseid John and Wyllyam my sonnes.
