The Will of William Ireland of the Parish of Horley in the County of Surrey, Yeoman, written 27 Dec 1648, proved 20 Apr 1649.

In the Name of God Amen I William Ireland of Horley in the County of Surrey Yemon being sick in bodey but in good and perfect remembrance thanks be to god doe ordaine and make this my last will and testament manner and forme following

First, I bequeath and committ my Soule to god etc... and for my body I will it be buried according to the disretion of my Executor. And for my goods and Chattells my will is they bee disposed of as followeth...

Item. I give to my Daughter Sara Sander wife of John Sannder tenn pounds.

Item. I give to <u>my Daughter Mary Ireland</u> tenn pounds to be paid to her at the age of wone and twenty yeares.

Item. I give to <u>my Sonne George Ireland</u> twenty pounds to bee paid to him at the age of wone and twentie years.

Item. I give to my Sonne Thomas Ireland fifteene pounds to bee paid to him at the age of wone and twentie yeares.

Item. I give to my Sonne John Ireland fifteene pounds to bee paid to him at the age of wone and twentie yeares.

Item. I give to <u>my Daughter Elizabeth Ireland</u> tenne pounds to be paid to her at the age of wone and twenty yeares.

All which Legacies or Summes of money before mencioned my will and meaneing is should be paid by my Executors.

All the rest of my goods and Chattells my Debts and legesies being paid and funerall expences discharged I give to <u>Sara my wife</u> and <u>William Ireland, my Sonne</u>, whome I make whole and full Executor of this my last will and testament.

In wittnes whereof I have to these presents put to my hand and seale this seven and twentie day of December One thousand six hundred forty eight.
