

London, England, Wills and Probate, 1507-1858, DW/PA/8/1683/33.

The Will of Elizabeth Isted of the Parish of Nutfield in the County of Surrey, Widdow, written 22 Jul 1680, proved 14 Jun 1683.

(Paragraphed)

In the Name of God Amen I Elisabeth Isted of Nutfeild in the Countey of Surrey Widdo doe make and ordaine my Last Will and Testament in maner & forme as followeth

Impr. I Bequeath my soule to god etc... And my Bodey to be decently Buried by my Executors.

Itt. I give to the pore of the parish of Nutfeild twenty shillinges.

Itt. I give to my sone John Isted twelve pounds to be paid to hime at michaelmas next Insewing my decease. I give to him 4 pair of toe sheets & one pair of fine sheets 1 duzzen of toe Napkins & six Coars towels & 8 fine napkins & cloth for and if my sone John dye all this money & goods shall goe to my sone Henry my Executor.

Itt. I give to my daughter Mary Isted fifty pounds to be paid to her two years next after my death & if my daughter Mary dey the said fifty pounds shall be devided between my sones William and Henry.

Itt. I give to my sone William the some of twenty pounds to be paid to hime when my sone Henry shall arive at the Age of one & twenty years.

Itt. my will and mind is yt the rest of my lineon not disposed of with all the bessham & yarne shall be Equally devided between my sones William & Henry & my daughter Mary.

Itt. I give all my coverlid yarne to my sone Henry. To this my last will & testament I make my sone Henry Isted my full & sole Executor of all my Goods & Chattels not before disposed of and I desier my loveing Brother Michaell Martin and my sone John Isted to be overseers and Assisting my said Executor and I desier my Executor and the two overseers of this my will to be kind to my Grand Child John Rogers when my said Executor shall come to one & twenty years of age.

This I make decleare & publish my Last Will & Testament this two & twentieth day of July 1680 renouncing all wills before made in wittness whereof I have set my hand and seale the day and yeare above written.
