Prerogative Court of Canterbury Wills, 1384-1858, PROB 11/479/266.

Abstract of the Will of Edward Linfeild of Lineplace in the Parish of Lingfield in the County of Surrey, Gentleman, written 10 Dec 1702, proved 24 Nov 1704.

Wills that his body be buried in the parish church of Lingfield alongside his father.

Gives and bequeaths 50 shillings to the poor of the parish of Lingfield.

Gives and devises to <u>his son James Linfeild</u> and his heirs all his messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments in England.

Gives and bequeaths £100 to his daughter Elizabeth Saxby.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his kinsman Richard Linfeild of Lingfield, mercer. *

All the rest and residue of his goods, chattels, leases and personal estates he gives and bequeaths to his said son James Linfeild whom he makes and appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
