Abstract of the Will of Nycholas Wright of the Parish of Newdigate in the County of Surrey, written 11 Nov 1579, proved 3 Mar 1580.

Gives to the poor man's box of the parish of Newdigate six shillings eight pence.

Gives £6 13s. 4d. to his daughter Agnes Wright.

Gives £6 13s. 4d. to his daughter Johan Wright.

Gives £6 13s. 4d. to <u>his other four daughters Katheryn Wright</u>, <u>Alice Wright</u>, <u>Faithe Wright</u>, and <u>Margarett Wright</u>, to be paid to them when the reach the age of 18 years.

Wills that if his wife remarries after his decease she shall pay an annuity of 20 shillings each to his sons Rychard Wright, Nycholas Wright, William Wright & Thomas Wright.

Wills that after the decease of his wife the residue of the term of his lease of the lands, tenements and premises called Mareland shall remain to his son Richard who in turn shall pay to his brothers Nicholas, William and Thomas £4 yearly between them. And if all his sons die then the said term of years will remain to his eldest daughter Agnes Wright, and so on.

Gives six shillings eight pence to <u>his goddaughter Faithe Wright</u>, and four pence to every one of his other godchildren.

The residue of his goods, chattels and debts owing to him he gives to <u>his wife Susan</u> who he makes sole executrix of his last will and testament.

He appoints Edward Willott and Nicholas Rickman overseers of his last will and testament, giving them 10 shillings each for their efforts.
