Gives and bequeaths 40 shillings to his son Richard.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to his daughter <u>Mary Dumbrell the wife of Richard Dumbrell</u> of Wivelsfield.

Gives and bequeaths £10 each to his grandchildren John Dumbrell, Richard Dumbrell, Francis Dumbrell, Mary Dumbrell, Elizabeth Dumbrell and Anne Dumbrell, children of his said daughter Mary, all under the age of 21 years.

Gives and bequeaths £10 each to <u>his grandchildren John Aridge, Thomas Aridge,</u> <u>Stephen Aridge, Dionise Aridge and Alice Aridge, children of his son Stephen Aridge,</u> all under the age of 21 years.

Gives £5 to Johane Aridge, daughter of his son Stephen, and wife of John Barkshell.

Gives £5 each to <u>Stephen Barkshell and Suzan Barkshell, children of the said John and Johane</u>, then under the age of 21 years.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to <u>Elianor Aridge daughter of his son George</u> <u>Aridge</u> deceased, then under the age of 21 years.

All the residue of his goods and chattels he gives and bequeaths to <u>his son</u> <u>Stephen</u> Aridge whom he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.
