Abstract of the Will of John Barnard of Place in the Parish of Goring in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 30 Sep 1624, proved 22 Mar 1627.

Gives 4 pence to the parish church of Chichester.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor of the parish of Goring.

Gives £100 to his son George Barnard, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives £100 to <u>his daughter Susan Barnard</u>, to be paid to her when she turns eighteen.

Gives £100 to <u>his daughter Marye Barnard</u>, to be paid to her when she turns eighteen.

Gives £100 to <u>his daughter Katheren Barnard</u>, to be paid to her when she turns eighteen.

Gives £100 to his daughter Sara Barnard, to be paid to her when she turns eighteen.

Gives to his servant John Barnard his diet and maintenance so long as he continues in service to his executors. And if he should depart said service, he bequeaths to him  $\pounds 5$ .

The residue of his goods and debts he gives and bequeaths to <u>his wife Mary</u> and <u>his</u> son John Barnard, appointing them co-executors of his last will and testament.

Appoints his friends Richard Cooke of Feldplace and Roger Hide of Holt, and <u>his brothers Beniamin Barnard</u> and <u>Barnabe Barnard</u>, overseers of this last will and testament.
