Abstract of the Will of Thomas Bond of the Parish of East Grinstead in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 9 May 1754, proved 16 Oct 1754.

Gives, devises and bequeaths an annuity or rent charge of £6 out of his farm and lands to <u>his wife Elizabeth</u>. He also gives her their bed and chest of drawers, the use of the little orchard next to the Common, residence in the house and the use of whatever household goods she wants, a hen and the profit of six sheep.

Gives, devises and bequeaths all his lands, tenements and hereditaments both freehold and copyhold in the parish of East Grinstead to <u>his son James Bond</u> and his heirs. And for want of such issue to his son Thomas Bond and his heirs.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to his son Edward Bond.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to his son Thomas Bond.

Gives and bequeaths 5 shillings each to his daughters Elizabeth and Sarah.

All the rest, residue and remainder of his goods, household goods, livestock, estate, chattels and effects he gives, devises and bequeaths to <u>his</u> said <u>son James</u>
Bond and his heirs, appointing him sole executor of his last will and testament.
