Abstract of the Will of William Bull of the Parish of Bolney in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 9 Jan 1647, proved 16 Jun 1647.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>his son James</u> all his wearing apparel, £4 10s., and 30 shillings to be paid to him by William's executrix during the term of her natural life.

Gives and bequeaths 50 shillings each to the children of <u>his son James</u> which he had by his current wife, to be paid to them when they reach the age of 21 years. And if either of them should die underage, then he wills the same to <u>James's eldest son</u>, <u>James</u>.

Gives and bequeaths £4 to <u>James's daughter Timmothy</u> which he had by his first wife.

Gives and bequeaths £3 to his daughter Mary.

Gives and bequeaths £3 to his daughter Anne.\*

Gives and bequeaths £3 to his daughter Johane.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>his daughter Susan's son William Lintott</u>\* the cupboard, table, benches and forms standing in the kitchen.

Gives and bequeaths 20 shillings to his daughter Susan's daughter Anne Lintott\*.

Gives and bequeaths 20 shillings to the poor of Bolney.

All the residue of his goods he gives and bequeaths to <u>his wife Blanch Bull</u> whom he makes sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Appoints <u>his sons-in-law John Lintott of Bolney and Thomas Burtenshawe of Cuckfield</u> the overseers of his last will and testament, paying them 5 shillings each for their efforts.
