Abstract of the Will of Sarah Carey of Brightling in the County of Sussex, Widow, written 20 May 1758, proved 26 Jan 1762.

Gives and devises to <u>her daughter Elizabeth Picknall</u>, <u>widow</u>, her freehold tenement, back garden and parcel of land of about 44 roods in Brightling where she now lives and which she purchased from <u>James Picknall</u>. And after the decease of <u>her daughter Elizabeth Picknall</u> she gives and devises the same to <u>Elizabeth's daughter</u>, <u>Mary Picknall</u> and her heirs. Wills that <u>her said granddaughter Mary Picknall</u> pay £5 to <u>Sarah Picknall</u>, <u>another daughter of Elizabeth</u>.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>her daughter Elizabeth Picknall</u> her clock, for the term of her natural life or until she remarries, after which she gives the clock to <u>her said</u> <u>granddaughter Mary Picknall</u>.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>her granddaughter Mary Picknal</u>l her bed, one round table and a deal chest.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>her two daughters Sarah Akehurst and Elizabeth</u> <u>Picknall</u> her wearing apparell, to be equally divided between them.

Gives and bequeaths to her said daughter Sarah Akehurst her chest of drawers.

Gives and bequeaths 1 guinea to <u>her son Samuel Martin of Rotherfield</u>, husbandman.

All her ready money and securities for money she gives and bequeaths to <u>her daughter Sarah Akehurst</u>.

All the rest and remainder of her household goods, linen, and other furniture, she gives and bequeaths to <u>her two daughters Sarah Akehurst and Elizabeth Picknall</u>, share and share alike.

Makes <u>her granddaughter Mary Picknall</u> and <u>her grandson Samuel Akehurst</u> coexecutors of her last will and testament.
