Devises to <u>his eldest son Benjamin Cramp</u> and to his friend John Wood of Bexhill, yeoman, in Trust, his freehold tenement called Saint Marys, with the stables, gardens, in the parish of St. Mary Bulverhythe in the Liberty of the town and port of Hastings, which he lately purchased from William White, to sell the said premises for the best price and to apply the money as follows....

Gives and bequeaths £50 each to <u>his son-in-law Thomas White of Eastbourne,</u> <u>husband of his daughter Rachel deceased</u>, to <u>his daughter Elizabeth Cruttenden wife of Edmund Cruttenden of Ninfield</u>, and to <u>his daughter Frances Stevens the wife of Samuel Stevens of Bexhill</u>.

Gives and devises to <u>his son Benjamin Cramp</u> all his messuage, barn buildings, lands and premises called Redhams in Clynchgreen in the parish of Bexhill which Benjamin now occupies.

Appoints <u>his son Benjamin Cramp</u> and his friend John Wood co-executors of his last will and testament, paying John Wood 5 guineas for his efforts.
