Abstract of the Will of Elizabeth Diggens of the City of Chichester, Widow, written 14 Jan 1832, proved 23 Feb 1836.

Gives & bequeaths all her wearing apparel and all her rings, trinkets and other ornaments to her daughter Charlotte Tufnell the wife of the Reverend Samuel Joliffe Tufnell.

States that she is entitled to the sum of £599 8s. 7d. currently in the Bank of England, such that after her debts and funeral expenses have been paid, she gives and bequeaths £206 to **her niece Charlotte Neal** for her own use and benefit.

All the rest and reside of the said £599 8s. 7d. she directs to be paid to her daughter Charlotte Tufnell at £10 half-yearly. And in case said Charlotte dies before the whole of the said residue has been paid, she directs that the remainder be paid to **her granddaughter Ellen Mary Tufnell**.

Gives & bequeaths all her mortgage securities and the monies due thereon, and all other monies, securities for money, goods, chattels and personal estate to her good friends John Randall of Oving in county Sussex, Gentleman, and James Bennett Freeland, Esquire, upon Trust, to the use and benefit of the children of **her sons Francis Diggens and John Diggens**.

Constitutes and appoints the said John Randall and James Bennett Freeland coexecutors of her last will and testament.
