Gives and bequeaths to <u>his son John</u> a silver salt marked with the first two letters of his name and also a silver spoon.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>his son Thomas</u> a silver salt marked with the first two letters of his name and also a silver spoon.

Gives and bequeaths to his son Christopher a silver spoon.

Gives and bequeaths to his son Langrish Fairhill one silver spoon.

All the rest of his goods, chattels and personal estate he gives and bequeaths to <u>his</u> wife Susann whom he appoints sole executrix of his last will and testament.
