

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/934/398.

Abstract of the Will of John Farhill of the City of Chichester in the County of Sussex, Esquire, written 25 Jun 1767, proved 30 Dec 1767.

Gives and devises to **his eldest son George Parker Farhill** the perpetual advowson of Lurgarshall which he lately purchased of John Darkson and also Little Horsea Island, one moiety whereof was his late mother's and the other moiety thereof he has lately purchased of William Smith Esq and his wife ... with remainder to **his brother-in-law George Sedgwick** and **his cousin Thomas Langrish** and their heirs in Trust..

Gives £5,000 to **his daughter Mary Farhill**.

Gives to **his wife Sarah** an annuity of £120 during her natural life...

Gives to his said wife, his son George, daughter Mary and **his youngest son John** (then under the age of 20 years) suits of mourning as well as all his lands lying near Chichester.

All the rest and residue of his real and personal estate he gives to his son George Parker Farhill and **his wife's brother Edward Carleton, Gent.** and their heirs.

Revokes the bequest of £5,000 to his daughter Mary and son-in-law George Forster Tufnell on 19 Oct 1767.
