

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers,
PROB 11/1429/169.

*Abstract of the Will of Sarah Farhill of the City of Chichester in the County of Sussex,
Widow, written 26 Jun 1802, proved 3 Aug 1805.*

Wills that her body be interred in the burial ground called 'Paradise' adjoining the
cathedral church of Chichester.

Bequeaths £10 to the poor of St. Peter the Less in Chichester.

Gives and bequeaths her copyhold lands and tenements within the manor of
Colworth called Wards to her daughter Mary Tufnell, widow, and her heirs, during the
life of Thomas Smith the younger. Also gives to Mary all the money she has in the
Chichester bank.

Gives £10 each for mourning to her grandsons William Tufnell, John Charles Tufnell
and Samuel Joliffe Tufnell.

Gives £10 for mourning to Mr. Richard Wilmot.

Gives a silver coffee pot to her granddaughter Uliana Tufnell.

Gives £10 to Elizabeth Poulam of Arundel, widow.

Gives mourning rings to Mr. and Mrs. Diggins, Mrs. Tiwman, Mrs. Bull, Mr. Edward
Carleton, and others.

All the rest of her goods, chattels, money, securities for money, and personal estate,
she gives and bequeaths one moiety to her said daughter Mary Tufnell, and the
other half to the children of her late son John Farhill.

Makes her grandson William Tufnell sole executor of her last will and testament.
