Abstract of the Will of Sarah Farhill of the City of Chichester in the County of Sussex, Widow, written 26 Jun 1802, proved 3 Aug 1805.

Wills that her body be interred in the burial ground called 'Paradise' adjoining the cathedral church of Chichester.

Bequeaths £10 to the poor of St. Peter the Less in Chichester.

Gives and bequeaths her copyhold lands and tenements within the manor of Colworth called Wards to <u>her daughter Mary Tufnell</u>, widow, and her heirs, during the life of Thomas Smith the younger. Also gives to <u>Mary</u> all the money she has in the Chichester bank.

Gives £10 each for mourning to <u>her grandsons William Tufnell</u>, <u>John Charles Tufnell</u> and Samuel Joliffe Tufnell.

Gives £10 for mourning to Mr. Richard Wilmot.

Gives a silver coffee pot to her granddaughter Uliana Tufnell.

Gives £10 to Elizabeth Poulam of Arundel, widow.

Gives mourning rings to Mr. and Mrs. Diggens, Mrs. Tiwman, Mrs. Bull, Mr. <u>Edward Carleton</u>, and others.

All the rest of her goods, chattels, money, securities for money, and personal estate, she gives and bequeaths one moiety to <u>her</u> said <u>daughter Mary Tufnell</u>, and the other half to the children of her late son John Farhill.

Makes <u>her grandson William Tufnell</u> sole executor of her last will and testament.
