Abstract of the Will of Samuel Jury of Battle in the County of Sussex, Shoemaker, written 11 Sep 1640, proved 15 Sep 1641.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor people of the parish of Battle to be distributed among them on the day of his funeral.

Gives £5 to his uncle Josua Jury.

Gives £40 to <u>his nephew Thomas Jury</u>, son of his brother Thomas Jury, to be paid to him when he reaches the age of twenty-one years or at the day of his marriage, whichever comes first.

Gives £20 to <u>his niece Suzan Jury</u> to be paid to her when she reaches the age of twenty-one years or at the day of her marriage, whichever comes first.

Gives £20 to <u>his niece Elizabeth Jury</u> to be paid to her when she reaches the age of twenty-one years or at the day of her marriage, whichever comes first.

Gives and devises to <u>his nephew Samuell Jury the son of Thomas Jury</u>, tailor, his messuages and tenements in Battle with the gardens and appurtenances.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives and bequeaths to <u>his brother Thomas</u> <u>Jury</u> whom he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.

Nominates his friends William Walker of Battle, yeoman, and Samuel Hoode of Ashburnham, yeoman, to be overseers of his last will and testament, giving them 10 shillings each for their efforts.
