Abstract of the Will of Elizabeth Langrish of West Ashling in the Parish of Funtington and County of Sussex, Widow, written 27 Mar 1637, proved 16 Feb 1637/8.

Wills that her body be buried in the parish church of Funtington.

Gives 4 pence to the cathedral church of Chichester.

Gives 12 pence to the parish church of Funtington.

Gives 30 shillings to the poor of the parish of Funtington.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor of the parish of Bosham.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor of the parish of Warblington.

Gives to her son William Langrish a little silver broach and her wedding ring.

Gives 5 shillings to her son Thomas Langrish.

Gives £25 to her daughter Anne Pey, by then a widow.

Gives £5 to her grandchildren Jane Pey, Francis Pey and Anne Pey, all under the age of 18 years.

Gives 1 shilling to her granddaughter Jane Pey.

Gives 1 shilling to her grandson Robert Langrish.

Gives 1 shilling each to her granddaughters Mary Langrish and Elizabeth Langrish daughters of her son John Langrish deceased.

Gives 1 shilling each to her granddaughters Marian Langrish, Elizabeth Langrish, Anne Langrish & Barbara Langrish daughters of her son Richard Langrish deceased.

Gives £20 each to her granddaughters Elizabeth Langrish, Joane Langrish and Anne Langrish daughters of her son Thomas Langrish, all under the age 18 years.

Gives £10 each to her grandsons **George Langrish**, **Thomas Langrish and Christopher Langrish**.

Gives to her son William Langrish a featherbed, a bolster and a pair of blankets.

Gives to her daughter Anne Pey all her wearing apparrel except one grogran? gown and kertle.

All the rest and residue of personal effects she gives to her son Thomas Langrish whom she makes the executor of her last will and testament.

Nominates her son William Langrish and friend Thomas Combes as overseers, giving them 5 shillings apiece for their pains.
