Abstract of the Will of James Lock the Elder of the Town and Port of Hastings in the County of Sussex, Mariner, written 2 Feb 1808, proved 11 Apr 1814.

Gives and devises to <u>his wife Elizabeth</u> his tenement in All Saints in Hastings with garden, hereditaments and premises, and also a net shop in St. Clement in Hastings, both of which he occupies. After her decease he wills the same to <u>his son James Lock</u> and his heirs.

Directs that after the death of his wife that £80 be paid out of the tenement and premises in All Saints to <u>his four grandchildren</u>, the children of his late son George <u>Lock</u>, namely <u>Elizabeth the wife of William Eaton</u>, <u>Sarah the wife of [blank] Hoad</u>, <u>Mary the wife of John Gallop and James Lock</u>, share and share alike.

Gives and bequeaths all his personal estate, property and effects to <u>his wife</u>
<u>Elizabeth</u> for the term of her natural life, and thereafter gives one half of the same to his son James Lock and the other half to his said four grandchildren.

Appoints <u>his wife Elizabeth</u> and <u>his son James Lock</u> co-executors of his last will and testament.
