Gives and bequeaths to <u>his said daughter Elizabeth Martin</u> his best feather bed and his clock. He gives the other feather bed to <u>his son Samuel Martin</u>.

Makes John Hammon of Wartling, gent, and <u>John Thatcher\* of Warbleton</u>, cordwainer, co-executors of his last will and testament.
