

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/106/397.

Abstract of the Will of John Moorye of Chidham in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 17 Apr 1605, proved 18 Dec 1605.

Wills that his body be buried in the church of Chidham.

Gives 20 pence to the cathedral church of Chichester.

Gives 2 shillings to the parish church of Chidham.

Gives 6 shillings 8 pence to the poor of Chidham.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of Funtington.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of Bosham.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of Donnyngton.

Gives to his servant William Ofley one bushel of barley.

Gives to his mayde servant Alice Campion one bushel of barley.

Gives £20 to **his daughter's son Robert Langredge**.

Gives £10 to **his daughter's daughter Elizabeth Langredge**.

Gives £10 to **his daughter's daughter Annes Colden wife of Peter Colden**.

Gives £10 to **his kinsman William Suter**.

Gives 20 shillings each to **John Moorey and Thomas Moorey, sons of his brother Thomas Moorey**.

Gives £100 to **John Moorey, Anthony Moorey, Walter Moorey, Jone Moorey and Sarah Moorey, children of his brother Anthonie Moorey**, to be equally divided between them.

Gives to **John Langridge his daughter's son** all his copyhold lands in Westborne now in the tenure and occupation of John Sutter. And in default of male heirs, then the same falls to the next heirs male of **his said daughter Elizabeth**.

Gives to **Richard Langredge his daughter's son** all his lands in the parish of Westborne purchased from John Freeland, gent. And in default of male heirs &c...

Gives to **William Langredge his daughter's son** his house in fee simple in the city of Chichester in the parish of All Saints commonly called the Pallante. And in default of male heirs &c....

Gives £100 to **Thomas Langridge his daughter's son**.

Gives and bequeaths to **his wife Agnes** all his free lands in the parish of Chidham, and in the tithing of West Ashling called "the Hill" now in the tenure and occupation of Robert Newton. Also gives to his wife Agnes half his household goods.

Gives and bequeaths to Thomas Langridge his daughter's son his lease of lands in Donnington...

Gives and bequeaths to **his son John Moorey** the rest of his free lands in Chidham, whom he nominates and appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.

Ordains and appoints Robert Trimlett of the parish of Bosham and **Richard Langridge his son-in-law** as overseers, given to them 40 shillings each for their pains.
