Prerogative Court of Canterbury Wills, 1384-1858, PROB 11/210/537.

Abstract of the Will of William Painter of Arlington, yeoman, written 30 Mar 1646, proved 19 Dec 1649.

Wills and devises that <u>his daughter Agnis Plesden</u>, <u>widow</u> of the parish of Arlington, have the rents, profits, issues and benefits of his lands and tenements in the parish of Healston in co. Sussex, during the term of her natural life.

He wills that the money arising from the sale of his abovesaid lands shall be paid to the <u>children of his two daughters</u>; viz. to <u>Ursilie Sherwood</u>, <u>Alexander Sherwood</u>, <u>Elizabeth the wife of James Arnoll</u>, <u>Leonard Millam</u>, <u>Margaret Millam</u>, <u>children of his daughter Agnis</u>; and <u>Edward Lanford</u>, <u>Robert Lanford</u> and <u>Thomas Lanford</u>, <u>children of his daughter Joane Lanford</u>, widow, late deceased.

Wills to <u>Ursilla Sharwood</u> his bed with the stedle, a blanket, a coverlet, and a joined chest.

Wills to Elizabeth Arnold his bedstedle at Whitdike and a flock bed.

Gives to his cousin Robert Lanford his bible.

The residue of his goods he gives to <u>his daughter Agnis</u> who he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.
