Original wills for the Peculiar Court of the Archbishop of Canterbury for the exempt deaneries of Pagham and Tarring, 1706-1858.

Abstract of the Will of Edmund Peachey of South Mundham in the Parish of Pagham in the County of Sussex, Gentleman, written 10 Sep 1760, proved 15 Nov 1760.

Gives and bequeaths £400 each to his six daughters Mary, Ann, Sarah, Jane, Elizabeth and Charlotte, after the death of his wife Mary, to be paid to them once they have turned twenty-one. If any of his daughters should die before they turn twenty-one, then her share or shares will go to his son William Peachey and his heirs.

Gives and bequeaths to <u>his youngest son Francis</u> an annuity of £6 during the widowhood of <u>his</u> said <u>wife Mary</u>.

Commits the care, tuition and guardianship of those of his children still in their nonage at the time of his decease to <u>his wife Mary and to her brother Thomas</u> Gravely of Merston in co. Sussex, yeoman.

Gives, devises and bequeaths his freehold messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments to <u>his eldest son William Peachey</u>, making him sole executor of his last will and testament.
