Abstract of the Will of William Sinnock of the Parish of Bexhill in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 8 Jun 1792, proved 24 Nov 1792.

Gives and devises to his wife Ann for the term of her natural life his freehold messuage or tenement garden and premises in Bexhill street in the parish of Bexhill now in the occupation of Thomas Christian and others. He also gives to his wife his leasehold messuage or tenement lands, hereditaments and premises called Stumblett Pitt and Pelhams Field, being near Sidley Green in Bexhill. He also gives £100 to his wife.

Gives and devises to <u>Sarah Sinnock the daughter of his late brother Thomas</u> <u>Sinnock</u> his freehold parcel of land called lower Busley Croft in Bexhill, currently occupied by <u>her mother Susannah Sinnock</u>, <u>widow</u>.

Gives and bequeaths £50 each to <u>his nieces Ann Smith and Sarah Smith</u>, and to <u>his sister Mercy the wife of James Cruttenden</u>.

Following the death of <u>his wife Ann</u> he entrusts the reversion of his freehold & leashold estates to his friends Joseph Newington and Thomas Lansdell, yeoman, both of Bexhill, to sell and to pay the proceeds to <u>his sister Mercy Cruttenden</u> and, following her death, to the maintenance and education of <u>his niece Sarah</u>

<u>Sinnock</u> and <u>his nieces Ann Smith and Sarah Smith, daughters of his said sister</u>

<u>Mercy Cruttenden by her first husband John Smith deceased.</u>

Appoints the said Joseph Newington and Thomas Lansdell executors of his last will and testament, bequeathing to them five guineas for their efforts.
