Devises his copyhold tenement and garden in Alciston together with three acres of land to <u>his son Henry Stephens</u> and his heirs forever.

Gives all his household goods, furniture, plate, linen and china which shall be in his dwelling house at the time of his decease to <u>his</u> said <u>sons Alexander Stephens and Henry Stephens</u>, share and share alike.

Directs that his executors or administrators shall hold the rest and residue of his personal estate in trust to divide in six parts and distribute to <u>his daughter Sophia</u>

<u>Carey the wife of Edward Carey of Ringmer</u> in the said county, farmer, <u>his son</u>

<u>James Stephens</u>, <u>his son Joseph Stephens</u>, <u>his son John Stephens</u>, <u>his son Thomas</u>

<u>Stephens</u>, and to <u>his son William Stephens</u>.

Constitutes and appoints <u>his sons Alexander Stephens and Henry Stephens</u> coexecutors in trust of his will.
