Gives and bequeaths £60 to his youngest son John Stoner, then under the age of 21 years.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his eldest daughter Elizabeth Stoner.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his second daughter Sarah Stoner.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his third daughter Hannah Stoner, then under the age of 21 years.

Gives and bequeaths £50 to his youngest daughter Mary Stoner, then under the age of 21 years.

All the residue of his goods, lands, tenements, hereditaments, cattle, chattels, utensils, and household implements he gives and bequeaths to <u>his wife Sarah Stoner</u> and <u>his eldest son</u> Thomas Stoner, whom he makes co-executors of his last will and testament.

Desires that his friends and <u>kinsmen John Payne</u> and <u>John Dungate</u>, both of West Hoathly, yeomen, be overseers of his last will and testament.
