Abstract of the Will of Nathan Taylor of Heathfield in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 3 May 1658, proved 4 Oct 1662.

Gives & bequeaths to <u>his wife Anne Taylor</u> his house and garden and associated lands called Sicklehatch for the term of her natural life. After her decease he gives the same to <u>his youngest son James Taylor</u>.

Also gives to <u>his wife Anne</u> £20, twelve bushells of wheat, eight bushells of corn malt, half his household stuff, and a heifer.

Gives 10 shillings each to <u>his grandchildren Anne & Alice Tysehurst</u>, to be paid to them when they turn twenty-one.

Gives 12 pence to his eldest son Nathaniel Taylor.

Gives 12 pence to his daughter Anne Wallett / Woollett.

All the rest of his goods, chattels &c. he gives to <u>his son James Taylor</u> whom he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.
