Abstract of the Will of Richard Tayler of Heathfield in the County of Sussex, written 22 Jan 1603, proved 8 Jul 1603.

Gives 2 shillings to the poor of the parish of Heathfield.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to <u>his daughter Margaret</u> to paid to her within two years of his decease. If Margaret dies before then, the said amount is to be divided between <u>her four children</u>, to wit: 20 shillings to <u>Joseph</u>, 20 shillings to <u>Rachel</u>, 20 shillings to <u>Lydia</u>, and 40 shillings to <u>Moses</u>, to be paid to <u>their father Moses Tiherst his sonin-law</u>.

Gives 10 shillings to his daughter Joane.

Gives £5 to his daughter Katharine.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to <u>his daughter Mary</u>, to be paid to her when she reaches the age of 18 years.

Gives £5 to <u>his daughter Elizabeth</u>, to be paid to her when she reaches the age of 18 years.

Gives 10 shillings to his son Thomas Taylor.

The residue of his goods & chattels he gives and bequeaths to <u>his wife</u> Katharine whom he makes sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Appoints his friends and <u>kinsmen</u> <u>John Fuller, John Taylor and Thomas</u> <u>Willard</u> overseers of his Will.

Directs that <u>his wife Katharine</u> shall receive an annuity or annual rent of £4 from his lands & tenements for the term of her natural life. After her decease he wills the same to <u>his son Thomas Taylor</u> and his heirs forever, conditional on Thomas paying £10 each to <u>his four sisters Joane</u>, <u>Katharine</u>, <u>Mary & Elizabeth</u>.
