Abstract of the Will of Nicholas Wright of the Parish of Rusper in the County of Sussex, written 21 Feb 1598/9, proved 16 Feb 1608/9.

Gives 3 shillings 4 pence to the poor of the parish of Rusper.

Gives to <u>his daughter Angel</u>, <u>her husband Thomas Leachford of Horley</u>, and their heirs, all his buildings, lands, tenements and hereditaments in the parish of Charlwood in co. Surrey, to have and to hold for ever.

Wills that Edward Wen his tenant shall have the occupation of his house and lands in Rusper rent free for one year after his decease. And after a year has expired, he wills and bequeaths the said house and lands in Rusper and all other of his buildings, lands and tenements in Rusper to Nicholas Wright, son of his late daughter Joane and her husband William Wright, and to the heirs of Nicholas; and in default of such heirs, to Angel Leachford and her heirs forever.

All the rest and residue of his goods not bequeathed to gives and bequeaths to the said <u>Thomas Leachford his son-in-law</u> and to the said Nicholas Wright his daughter Joane's son, whom he makes co-executors of his last will and testament.

Appoints his friends <u>Joseph Browne</u>, <u>parson of Rusper</u>, and Richard Ede of the same place, as overseers of his last will and testament.
