Gives to **her cousin Jeane Taylor** two shillings sixpence a year for as long as she lives to keep her from the alms of the parish.

Allows £8 to cover her funeral expenses.

Makes her cousin Thomas Chesterman of Tocknam the sole executor of her last will and testament.
