

Probate records of the Archdeaconry of Wiltshire, Reference: P2/5Reg/96A.

Abstract of the Will of Christopher Elliott of the Parish of Compton Chamberlayne in County Wilts, written 7 Aug 1570, proved 5 Oct 1570.

Wills that his body be buried in the churchyard of St. Michaels before the chancel door.

Gives and bequeaths 4 pence to the mother church of Sarum.

Bequeaths to his parish church of Compton Chamberlayne 12 pence toward its reparations.

Bequeaths sixpence to William Lambert, clerk.

Gives to **his daughter Johan Elliott** 40 shillings, a brass pan, a little brass pot, a platter, and a pottinger.

Gives to **his daughter Margaret Elliott** 40 shillings, a pair of sheets, a bearing sheet, a lockrome sheet, his best pan of brass, a platter, a pottinger and his worst brass pot.

Bequeaths to **his son James Elliott** 40 shillings, a brass pot, a brass pan, a platter, and a pottinger.

Bequeaths to **his son John Elliott** his cart and all its belongings, the yoke & plough chain, the draught chain, a cow calf, a brass pot, and a brass pan.

If his wife re-marries then **his son John** is to have half the corn and to pay his debts of 26 shillings 8 pence.

Bequeaths to **his wife's son, Robert**, an ox calf.

The residue of his goods he bequeaths to **his wife Alice** whom he appoints sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Desires that Thomas Martin and **William Elliott** be the overseers of his last will and testament.
