Gives & devises to **his son John Horsell** half of the close adjoining his dwelling house as well as a coffer & table board.

Gives to **his son Bartholomew Horsell** the other half of the said close, along with a bed and bedstead and all their appurtenances.

Gives & devises to **his wife Mary** the cottage or tenement and the garden area adjoining it, where his son Bartholomew currently lives.

Gives & bequeaths 20 shillings each to his daughters Mary, Ann, Lidia and Elizabeth.

Gives & bequeaths £5 to his son Reubin.

Gives & bequeaths 50 shillings to his son William and a little brass pot.

Gives to his said daughter Elizabeth the bed she now sleeps in.

Gives to his said daughter Ann the bed she now sleeps in.

Gives to his said daughter Lidia his brass brewing

Gives to his said daughter Mary his iron pot.

Makes his wife sole executrix of his last will and testament.
